

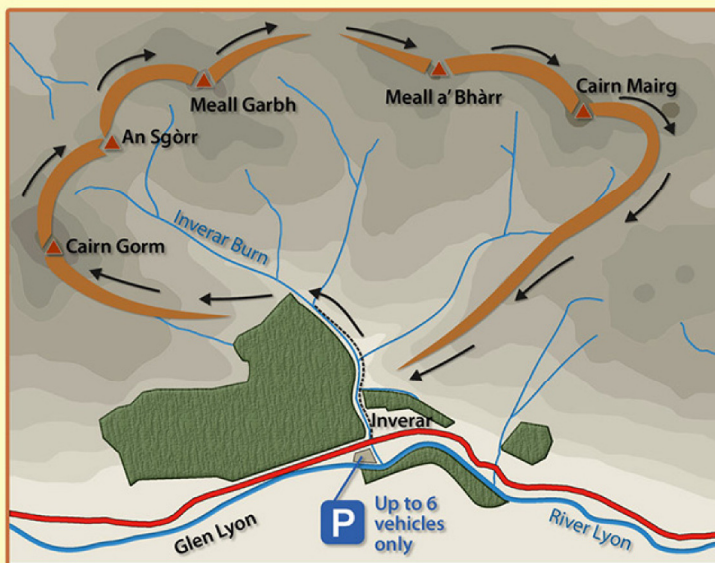
# Welcome to North Chesthill Estate

You can quietly enjoy what access to this space offers but please leave it undisturbed and unmarked to ensure it remains sustainable for centuries to come:

- You are about to enter a legally protected conservation wilderness space; a Rural Business space
- Exercise this privilege with responsibility
- Work within the conservation guidelines outlined on this notice to continue to protect the area, its animals and birds

## The Recognised Route and Path

For your enjoyment, stay with the recognised route clockwise (See Map). Follow the orange and green waymarkers.



Also, The Route:

- Protects against adverse human impacts to the animals and birds
- Reduces stress to deer and birds at sensitive times, like calving and nesting in April – July
- Reduces adverse impacts during the build up to the deer breeding/rutting in the autumn
- Protects the management of deer numbers which supports the local economy and environment
- Prevents harm to plants and local ecosystems in the protected space

## How you can help

- Stay on the Recognised Route and Path
- Minimise any time spent off the recognised route and path
- Avoid Corries and stay on the ridges, especially during calving (spring) and the stalking season (mid-August, but mainly Sept and Oct)
- Avoid Red Deer
- Keep dogs on leads at all times.



### Access Management – The Access Code allows for limitations on access when the estate is conducting its wildlife operations on the open hill.

- Restrictions to parking and access have been introduced. Do not park on the roadside verges in the restricted zone. If you do, the Council Parking Wardens will issue you with a parking ticket. This is to allow the local community to function safely.
- We are closing the car park during September and October to help us manage visitor pressure at that time.
- Please work with us and come back another day. Lots of other places to walk in the interim.
